Here are some of the money saving ideas the committee presented to our membership:

- Meeting Night Dinners (of which we had 9 out of 12 months). Thank you to all the folks who cooked, cleaned, and participated.
- Raffles at our monthly meetings.
 Again, many thanks to all of you who participated and donated raffle gifts.
- Placing the Newsletters in member mail boxes.
- Using email for distribution of the Newsletter.
- After the Revenue Committee figured the percent of profit on all bar beverages, the committee recommended raising the price on

certain beverages.

I know you are all aware the seawall is being replaced at the south end of the Club by Areas 2 and 5. This wall is no cost to the Club. In fact, we will bank a few bucks. The reasons:

- The County paid for the Sheet Piling.
- The members are doing the work. Thanks to Tony Chapman, Dave Davidson, John Hunter, Ed Ellidge, Lonnie Gibson, Dwayne Minick, and Dave MacDougall.
- The equipment was no cost to the Club. Thanks to John Hunter, Jr., for graciously donating the air compressor to run the jack hammer. Thanks to Joe Ortiz for delivering the air compressor on his own time, Tony Chapman for donating the jack hammer, and Dwayne Minick for having his welder onsite and using it at a moment's notice. We will be sending a thank you letter to all nonmembers who have donated equipment. Had the above tools not been donated, the cost would have been much, much more.

Our Gate Project is in the works. Lawny Chapman had the gate and fence delivered at the Club and it looks great. The price was so far below what we had expected—so thanks Lawny! Tony Chapman got the light poles and many extensions to use on the project. Again the cost was far less than we had anticipated. Tony has the first poles cemented in. John Hunter had the trench dug for all the wiring to be underground, and John Hunter Jr. donated the ditch witch for digging the trench. Again, we had to rent nothing. Hopefully, the gate will be operational by year-end. Again, this project should be at no cost to the Club due to Mirant's agreement to pay for the gate.

The last issue I have is the four foot pipeline running from K-Mart to the river. The timeframe for repair appears to be around April (after the rains). I will give you more information as I receive it.

Again, I want to thank everyone who helped and contributed to the many projects that I have been involved with during 2003. Congratulations to our newly elected officers for 2004. I wish everyone a save Holiday Season.
